We've been producing bedding for healthy and restorative sleep in our hometown, Neukirchen-Vluyn, since 1854. The health and technical skills of our employees are our most valuable asset.

Maybe it all started with a bad night's sleep. It may have also just been a keen sense for a basic human need – to sleep well – that Gertrude and Wilhelm Kremers recognized in 1854. They founded a wadding and quilt factory in the village of Vluyn. To this day, craftsmanship remains a guarantee of high-quality products.

The story of Kremers Paradies bedding is defined by numerous pioneering achievements. The popular blankets were initially filled with torn and cleaned textiles or cotton. This was soon followed by the development of the first duvet filled with sheep's wool. Not long after, they impressed their customers with the first industrially manufactured duvet.

This led to a long success story, which took the company to the top in the truest sense of the word: in 1953 the Willy Merkl memorial expedition, led by Karl Herrligkoffer, was the first to ascend the Nanga Parbat (Himalayas) from the north side. Included in the gear to survive the freezing cold were sleeping bags from the Lower Rhine, filled with the predecessors of the current textile fibers.

As John Lennon and Yoko Ono were demonstrating for world peace in a bed in 1969, the fourth generation of

Kremers was ensuring paradisiacal conditions in German bedrooms: with the

invention of the first washable quilts, filled with textile fibers.

We're at home on the Lower Rhine, and have been for many generations. The heart of our company beats in the tranquil town of Neukirchen-Vluyn – here, where the horizon is wide and the air is clear.

The Lower Rhine is characterized by a pragmatic and hardworking breed of people. Down-to-earth, always candid, and with strong leg muscles, because the bicycle is the transport of choice in these parts. Agriculture and horticulture dominate the picture in this rich cultural landscape. Broad fields intermingle with lush meadows. The numerous cows peacefully lift their noses towards the breeze, while old creeks provide a quiet refuge for flora and fauna. Migrating birds are popular guests.

A region with its qualities, and people that preserve and nurture their environment and allow it to prosper with an awareness of these qualities. For us, it is our obvious home – it is where most of our employees live, in peace, and always with a view to the next generation.

Every day we do our best to distinguish between good and excellent raw materials – and to use only the best materials for Paradies bedding. We allow ourselves the claim that we produce impressive bedding without compromise.

This claim is backed up by the latest test methods and extensive guidelines. While our cutting-edge machines can do a lot, there's one thing they cannot do: replace our employees. A wise forest owner does not chop more wood than they can regrow. This protects their business and ensures that they operate sustainably in the best sense of the word. We also make sure that we do not saw off the branch on which we all sit. All of the things we do as a company are based on the fundamental principle sustainability. Therefore, we of also adhere to these standards when it comes to the actual production process itself. We use natural resources and renewable or recyclable raw materials in our products wherever possible, which means we source 100% of our electricity from solar energy and are a certified Ökoprofit company. Our production has long been climate-neutral and free of harmful

substances, with the most efficient use of power and heat possible and recycling of residual materials. But sustainable behavior is not limited to our company. As part of society, we also take responsibility in this respect: we support numerous aid projects with donations and activities. We do a lot of things right, but not everything is perfect yet. For example, we have so far not been able to use "organic" components for all of our bedding. This is because we have not yet been able to achieve a consistently high quality in line with our standards. But we are working on it. With a clear conscience.

Everyone should be concerned with achieving climate neutrality and reducing CO_2 emissions, as the increase in greenhouse gases affects climate change all over the world. From a global perspective, much can be done in this respect. Paradies has been working for years to reduce its own CO_2 emissions and is committed to carbon offset projects worldwide. We currently offset our annual CO_2 emissions of 600 metric tons, but are always working on additional opportunities for reduction. Paradies is proud to have received the "climate-neutral" certificate for its efforts.



Climate protection project: CO2-offset Improved water infrastructure

This climate protection project in sub-Saharan Africa (Malawi, Uganda, Rwanda, Eritrea) helps people in rural areas to access clean drinking water. It takes care of repairing broken wells, digging new ones, and installing manual water pumps. The project has led to improved living conditions in many aspects.



Climate protection project: CO2-offset Reforestation

This climate protection project in Kenya enables small farms to plant trees on their land if they can guarantee that the majority of their land continues to be used for agricultural purposes. The farmers receive annual payments to plant and take care of the trees. There are currently 63000 participants in the project; over 8 million trees have been planted.



Climate protection project: CO2-offset Protection of biodiversity

This climate protection project in Indonesia helps to protect and conserve 47000 hectares of reforested swamp land. This provides particular protection to the Bornean orangutan, a species native to the land and facing extinction. The project conserves and protects the ecosystem by building physical developing barriers, infrastructure, putting anti forest fire measures in place, and educating and training the local population.

Code of Conduct

Paradies operates in accordance with the standards of the German textile and fashion industry

Companies in the German textile and fashion industry are committed to social responsibility, regardless of whether they conduct business in Germany, Europe, or other parts of the world. Driven by the responsible awareness of the social, environmental, and economic structure of the entire textile value chain, they respond to the challenges of an increasingly networked and global economy. To provide companies with the appropriate support, the Confederation of the German Textile and Fashion Industry and its member associations have developed this Code of Conduct.

The associations recommend using this Code of Conduct, which is available to all companies in the industry as a voluntary instrument and serves as a manual for socially responsible company activities. The primary function of the code is to reveal areas of responsibility in company activities



and provide a framework on which companies can base their individual policies. For its implementation in the global value chain, the code contains practical basic rules that small and medium-sized enterprises in particular can follow with their different business models and capacities.

The Code of Conduct is based on internationally recognized principles for protecting human and labor rights, as expressed in the United Nations' Universal Declaration of Human Rights, the ILO's core labor standards, the UN Guiding Principles on Business and Human Rights, and the OECD Guidelines for Multinational Enterprises. The code is also based on the objectives of relevant national initiatives such as the Partnership for Sustainable Textiles, the National Action Plan on Business and Human Rights, and international agreements to protect the environment.

These international law agreements apply to countries rather than companies, and governments are responsible for enforcing them. Companies in the textile and fashion industry support the goal of respecting human rights and fulfilling labor, social, and environmental standards in economic value creation processes. Companies can do their part by aligning their operations with the principles outlined in these international law agreements – in the knowledge that this is a long-term process that requires constructive and pragmatic collaboration among government institutions, social actors, and companies.

Conditions of Purchase



Careful Selection of Suppliers

Paradies conditions of purchase related to established limit values for harmful substances ensure the human-ecological safety of Paradies products.

To protect the environment and ensure the human-ecological safety of Paradies products, the materials supplied to Paradies must fulfill the specifications outlined in the Paradies conditions of purchase.

The materials and products supplied in accordance with the concluded contracts and orders comply with the laws, technical and general standards, and other technical regulations governing use such as the German Consumer Goods Ordinance (BedGgstV), the German Food and Feed Code (LFGB), the Chemicals Prohibition Ordinance (ChemVerbotsV), the euroLATEX ECO-Standard, the Hazardous Substances Ordinance (GefStoffV), the Technical Rules for Hazardous Substances (TRGS), STANDARD 100 by OEKO-TEX, the Textile Labelling Act (TextilKennzG), the Packaging Ordinance (VerpackV), and EU directives (ECC, the German Equipment and Product Safety Act [GPSG], the REACH regulation, etc.).

Paradies always bases its material and product specifications on consumeroriented and environmental limit values. The limit values for harmful substances established by Paradies are also more stringent than conventional market standards.

STANDARD 100 by OEKO-TEX, Class 1

One of the standards that must be fulfilled is STANDARD 100 by OEKO-TEX. If no other more stringent limit values have been defined, the materials and products supplied to Paradies must also comply with the limit values of product class 1 (babies and toddlers) of STANDARD 100 by OEKO-TEX.

REACH Regulation

No products and materials supplied to Paradies may contain any of the substances on the REACH regulation's SVHC list (the current SVHC list is published on the European Chemicals Agency website at www.echa.europa. com).

First Delivery

Before any new specified material or product is delivered for the first time, Paradies must be provided with proof of compliance with the conditions of purchase. This can, for example, take the form of certificates and/or confirmations of material tests already conducted. The limit values identified and methods of measurement or analysis must be presented to Paradies.

Unless otherwise specified, the analysis methods for groups of harmful substances are defined by law, technical and general standards, and other technical regulations. Compliance with limit values must be confirmed by a specialized institute using suitable methods.

Routine Auditing

Companies are required to conduct analyses on a regular basis – at least once every twelve months – and provide Paradies with confirmation in the form of certificates, without being asked. A standardized production process and suitable quality assurance measures must be used to ensure that the required limit values are observed at all times. If requested by Paradies, detailed analysis reports are to be submitted that verify compliance with the required limit values.

Based on the confirmations and certificates presented, Paradies will provide its customers with confirmation of limit value compliance. Paradies reserves the right to have its own random sampling and analysis conducted.

We regularly inspect the local standards and conditions to ensure they meet requirements. We want our customers to know that Paradies cares. This year, again, we visited our suppliers.

Towards a "green" weaving mill

The first stop on the journey brought us to our suppliers in Egypt. In 1991, an initiative launched by cotton farmers here achieved a major success: "A ban on pesticides in cotton production." We had been considering the idea of visiting the cotton farmers in Egypt since the start of the year. As we already use a high proportion of organic cotton fabric in our products, we wanted to experience, feel and better understand what organic cotton really means.

The Indian cotton farmers have chosen to take an organic approach to farming. We support them in this decision by, to the greatest degree possible, purchasing only organic cotton from our suppliers. Currently, only around 1% of global cotton production can be classified as organic. As a consumer you can help boost this figure by actively choosing organic cotton.

The textile industry is Pakistan's most important economic sector, accounting for more than half of the country's exports. We visited one of the country's many hundreds of weaving mills – and it was a very special one, as the management are committed to making the company increasingly "green".

The company wants to reduce its carbon footprint and produce in an increasingly sustainable manner. One important step involves a new facility for treating waste water. RESPONSIBLE USE OF RAW MATERIALS

Paradies is considered to be a pioneer in the development and production of organic bedding. In 1977, the company successfully launched its Paradies Biofill® natural fillings (textile fibers) and Paradies Biolana® (new sheep's wool) with the motto "Natürlich Paradies" (Naturally Paradies). Biofill[®] was further Paradies developed into an innovative and eco-friendly textile fiber made from annually renewable raw materials an absolute product innovation.

And we've never gotten tired of continuously developing our organic fillings, with the ultimate aim of combining responsible behavior and sustainability with unrivalled sleeping comfort. Introduced in 2009, **Paradies Fill® 2.0** made from recycled PET material is yet another innovation resulting from many years of research in true Paradies brand quality and an example of a responsible approach to the future and environment.

For more than 165 years, we've always been motivated to do more research and develop sustainable bedding and products for a more comfortable life.

Paradies product research is always on the lookout for new ways to conserve resources and promote healthy sleep.

Hibea Bio with the natural Paradies Biofill[®] filling is a gift from Mother Nature – and the first duvet made from textile fibers created by people out of annually renewable raw materials.

The raw material used to create this innovative textile fiber filling is recycled, high-quality PET. Following careful sorting and cleaning processes, the recycled material is finely shredded into flakes that are so pure that they can also be used for food packaging or woven directly into polyester fibers.

Maximum Industry Standards

Additional Requirements Related to Down and Feather Filling Material

In addition to the criteria outlined in the Paradies conditions of purchase, down and feathers supplied to Paradies as a filling material must also fulfill the following requirements:

1. The down and feather filling materials used by Paradies GmbH are of European origin and **are not plucked while the animal is still alive or sourced from animals used in the production of foie gras.**

2. **Animal welfare** standards are stringently observed and compliance monitored, with medical care provided to the animals.

Animals are kept and slaughtered in accordance with the recommendations of the Standing Committee of the European Convention for the protection of animals kept for farming purposes as well as the animal welfare regulations of the country of origin.

3. Paradies GmbH only sources fully treated down and feather filling materials. The goods are **washed, sterilized**, and steamed at temperatures between 120 and 130°C for 30 minutes. The down and feather filling material supplied to Paradies GmbH is **free of viruses**.

4. The down and feather filling material supplied to Paradies GmbH is a **new product**, and the composition labelling fulfills **class I** of the **European EN 12934 standard**.

5. The down and feather filling material supplied to Paradies GmbH **fulfills the hygiene and purity requirements** of the European EN 12935 standard.

6. The **more stringent SuperClean standard** defined by Paradies GmbH, which enables **a higher degree of purity due to additional cleaning processes**, is also guaranteed. The result is thus a turbidity value of at least 500 mm (rather than the 300 mm of the EN standard) and an oxygen level of < 4.8 (rather than the < 20 of the EN standard).

We clearly distinguish between goose down and duck down on our product label in accordance with the EN 12934 standard. In contrast, the market often only lists down for products containing duck down. The quality of the down has more to do with animal welfare, feed, and the age of the animal than its origin. All of our down in the high-quality Paradies range is of European

Paradies has stringently observed animal welfare standards and audited compliance for many years. In the early **90s**, Paradies defined additional conditions of purchase for down and feathers, stipulating that down and feathers may not be plucked while the animal is still alive or sourced from animals used in the production of foie gras. In addition, our suppliers have always been required to strictly observe animal welfare standards and audit compliance.

The RDS certification (IDFL 005816) additionally guarantees our customers documentation and full transparency of the supply chain with integrated traceability.

After consultations with the VIER PFOTEN animal welfare organization in 2017, we opted for this, the internationally most stringent standard.

This also means that down and feathers supplied to Paradies GmbH are sourced from geese and ducks kept in strict accordance to animal welfare provisions and do not come from animals which have been live-plucked or force-fed (foie gras production).

All raw materials supplied to Paradies comply with the Oeko-Tex®Standard 100, product class 1 for baby products. The international OEKO-TEX® association is responsible for testing for harmful substances in accordance with STANDARD 100 by OEKO-TEX®.

The certificate issued by Fördergemeinschaft Körperverträgliche Textilien e.V. confirms that all fabrics and coverings are clinically tested to ensure they're kind to the skin and body.

Paradies is a founding member of the association.
